 - 2. Kind (good)
 - 3. Contentedness (does not envy)
 - 4. Humble (does not boast)
 - 5. Modest (not puffed up)
 - 6. Gentle (is not rude)
 - 7. Benevolent (does not seek its own)
 - 8. Joyful (is not provoked)
 - 9. Merciful (thinks no evil)
 - 10. Abhors evil (does not rejoice in iniquity)
 - 11. Delights in righteousness (rejoices in truth)
 - 12. Protective (bears all things)
