I. Joyful (Gladness and Rejoicing)

- Love is not provoked (1 Cor. 13:5)
 - A. The God who created the cosmos and who orchestrated and leads history with all power and perfection is filled with Joy and delight over His creation. He took great delight in making His creation and is filled with gladness as He thinks about where our future with Him is headed.
 - B. This characteristic (Joy) of God's love and nature is very much overlooked and shrouded in unbelief. We usually think of Him as unattached and stoic or even worse, as downcast and disappointed in how everything He created is turning out.
 - C. Scripture after scripture speaks to us about a God who is hopeful, loving, glad, and rejoicing as He rules over all things. His heart is engaged and energized with zeal for the joy that is set before Him.
